## Top Ten Questions Catholics Are Usually Asked

### Question 2 If you died tonight, would you go to Heaven?

Catholics have an assurance of salvation if they are faithful and try to keep God’s Commandments (1 Jn 2:3), if they died in the state of grace, i.e. in communion with or in friendship with God, they are assured of heaven. Salvation is pure gift extended by God through Jesus His Son, to all. But to enter Heaven, one must accept God’s gift, God’s love and always be striving to be returning that love. To enter Heaven one must be holy because “nothing unclean shall enter it” (Rev 21:27 –see also Is 4:4, Mal 3:2-4). The cleansing and purifying of any remaining sin or debt due in justice to God, which makes us fit to enter God’s holy presence, is what Catholics call Purgatory. This is clearly indicated in St. Paul’s writings: “Each man’s work will become manifest; for the day will disclose it, because it will be revealed with fire, and the fire will test what sort of work each one has done.... If any man’s work is burned up, he will suffer loss, though he himself be saved, but only as through fire” (1 Cor 3:13, 15). “For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each one may receive good or evil, according to what He has done in the body” (2 Cor 5:10). Ultimately salvation is a gift. God, and God alone knows who will enter heaven and when.

### Martin De Porres (1579-1639) November 3

St. Martin de Porres was born in Lima, Peru, the illegitimate son of a Spanish nobleman and a Panamanian mother. At 12, he was apprenticed to a barber-surgeon, from whom he learned the medical arts of the day as well as barbering. A few years later, he entered the Dominican order as a lay brother. He served as infirmarian and became known for his compassionate care of the sick and the poor. At his canonization, Pope John XXIII said, "he loved [others] because he honestly looked on them as God's children and as his own brothers and sisters... He was tireless in his efforts to reform the criminal, and he would sit up with the sick to bring them comfort. For the poor he would provide food, clothing, and medicine." A passionate advocate for equal rights for all classes of people, he is revered as the patron saint of social justice. He was also a man of prayer, spending long hours before the Blessed Sacrament. This good steward humbly used all he had-his prayers, his skills, his compassion-in the service of others. St. Martin de Porres, pray for us.

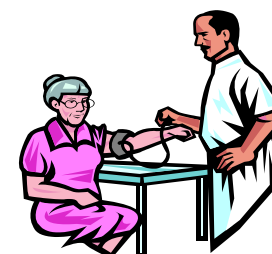

Women who have had abortions are more likely to abuse drugs and alcohol and have a 248% greater risk of suicide. Through your gifts, our diocese is able to offer the Rachel's Vineyard Retreat program, which ministers to those who have been hurt by abortion.
